FORGIVENESS By Carmel Gittens

I have been involved in visiting people (in my mental health work and my ministry) for over 20 years now, and I find some of the biggest problems form around the question of forgiveness. When people feel wronged it is so easy and natural to demand justice and even revenge.

I have also found that one of the biggest blocks to health (mental, physical and spiritual) is the inability to forgive. When we are unforgiving, it is like an open wound that we won't allow to heal.

Yet we see people on television who have lost loved ones to violent crime, who can say "I have forgiven the perpetrator and pray that they will find peace and turn away from their crimes"....

WHAT!! Someone has just killed your husband, wife or child. How can you can say that?

FORGIVENESS

And the answer is often, because I am a Christian, and the bible tells us to forgive.

No matter whether we could say the same, we have to be impressed by the grace, mercy and kindness we see in these people. And importantly we need to recognise that they all say the same thing: that although they are very sad, they have found a lasting peace in their act of forgiveness.

My lovely dad was only 5'1" but used to say that it takes a big man to say a little word "sorry". Even when we feel the other person is in the wrong, saying "sorry" is often the most powerful thing we can do. And "sorry, please forgive me" even more so. In my experience the other person will often then apologise too, and ask for your forgiveness in return. But even if they do not, it is still possible for you to forgive and move on.

Forgiveness in the Bible is a prominent theme, but the act of forgiving does not come easy to most of us. Our natural instinct when we've been injured is to recoil in self-protection, rather than overflow with mercy, grace and understanding.

I believe forgiveness is a choice we make, through a decision of our will, motivated by obedience to God and his command to forgive. The Bible tells us to forgive as the Lord forgave us, in Colossians 3:13 we read "Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." (NIV).

So we forgive by faith, out of obedience, whether we feel like it or not. We must trust God to do the work in us that needs to be done, so that the forgiveness will be complete.

But how will we know if we have truly forgiven? We will know the work of forgiveness is complete when we experience the freedom and inner peace that comes as a result. We are the ones who suffer most when we choose not to forgive. When we do forgive, the Lord sets our hearts free from the anger, bitterness, resentment and hurt that previously imprisoned us.

Most times, however, forgiveness is a slow process, in Matthew 18:21-22, we are told that we have to keep on forgiving "Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times," (NIV)

Jesus' answer makes it clear that forgiveness is not easy. Forgiveness may require a lifetime of forgiving, but it is important to Jesus. We must continue forgiving until the matter is settled in our heart.

I have found that prayer is one of the best ways to break down the wall of unforgiveness in my heart. When I begin to pray for the person who has wronged me, God gives me new eyes to see and a new heart to care for that person. As I pray, I start to see that person as God sees them, and I realize that he or she is precious to the Lord. I also see myself in a new light, just as guilty of sin and failure as the other person. I too am in need of forgiveness. If God did not withhold his forgiveness from me, why should I withhold my forgiveness from another?

We forgive out of obedience to the Lord. It is a choice, a decision we make. However, as we do this "forgiving," we discover the command is in place for our own good, and we receive the reward of our forgiveness - Freedom.

THE VICAR'S LETTER – HOPE and EXPECTATION

As I write this article England are about to kick off their world cup campaign against Italy. The beer, snacks, t-shirts and flags are flying off the supermarket shelves. There is a passion to see the national team do well. By the time you read this of course, England's World Cup may be all over and the team could be on their way home. However for the moment I live in at least hope, even if I cannot muster up too much expectation.

The world cup of course is a fantastic spectacle – the greatest show on earth – but this year it has been dogged by stories of embarrassing corruption in Fifa, with over paid untouchables seemingly lining their pockets, and stories of social unrest in Brazil as stadiums have been built at enormous social cost to the poor communities of that country. (Thank goodness for Test Match Special – that's what I say) However, I, like many,

still cling to the hope that England will do well at the World Cup and at least better than they did in South Africa last time.

In contrast 'hope' is a key element of our faith. As Christians we have hope in eternal life. We have a hope that one day there will be a new heaven and a new earth. We have a hope that God hears us and wants to speak to us, that he is for us and wants to help us live well in a crazy mixed up and often very painful world. Indeed this hope becomes expectation as we hear of friends who know a Jesus like this personally, or when we ourselves encounter a living Jesus.

The hope we have as Christians is based on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and an expectation that one day he will return and right every wrong.

Right now I am hoping England will do well in the World Cup but the hope I have in Jesus is quite different. My hope in Jesus is more like a quiet certainty, while my hope in the English Football team is to be honest without any real sense of expectation.

ALDWARK AREA PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2013/2014

In addition to the work reported in last month's newsletter, The Parish Council has also been active as follows:

Waste Spreading -The Parish Council met with Coast to Coast Re-Cycling Ltd. regarding the nuisance caused to residents by the spreading of waste on farmland and negotiated guidelines for its activities in the parish. To date the agreement appears to be working well as no serious complaints have been reported.

Street Lighting - Following NYCC's proposal to save energy by switching off certain street lights between midnight and 5am, it was agreed that two streetlights in Aldwark and Flawith would remain lit for security reasons.

Drains in Flawith - Work on the drains in Flawith was carried out by Yorkshire Water and we hope this problem has now been resolved.

Adoption of the disused Telephone Kiosk in Aldwark - The Parish Council acquired the disused telephone kiosk in Aldwark from BT and is grateful to Brian Warris who repainted it and fitted it out for use as a Book Exchange.

Superfast Broadband - The Parish Council d arranged a well-attended public meeting in January to consider ways in which Superfast Broadband could be brought to villages within the parish which would not benefit from the new BT service. As a result, 'I Love Broadband', is now offering Superfast Broadband to residents of Flawith, Youlton, Aldwark and Mytonon-Swale using modern radio technology.

Winter Weather Arrangements - It was agreed to ask local people and farmers with 4x4s and tractors to assist in any support that was required by residents who might be at risk during adverse weather conditions. Please let the Parish Council know if you are aware of any residents who might need some help.

Roads, verges and pavements - Following extremely wet weather and the road closure in Newton on Ouse due to flooding, the roads and footpaths in the parish were left in a very poor condition. Regular requests were made to NYCC Highways to carry out repairs. Due to cuts in the County Council's budget, this was only partly achieved but further repairs to the roads are planned, including a major refurbishment of the road from Aldwark village to Aldwark Bridge.

Deliveries will be made as soon as Tate Fuels have enough orders for a full tanker load to this area, with a guaranteed maximum of one month wait. In practice it will be very much shorter. It was interesting to hear how John, with a PhD in cancer research, and his wife Jane a ceramics artist, came to set up the brewery, and all the hurdles - physical and bureaucratic - that they had to overcome to succeed. Producing a good beer is highly labour intensive and requires a very large amount of water (hence their own reed bed). We smelt and tasted different hops and flavourings and John had brought samples of their 3 most popular beers. This went down particularly well with the men and even those of us who don't like beer did enjoy the famous "Yorkshire Sparkle". They mostly sell direct to restaurants and pubs, but are open to the public certain times each week. Then followed a report of the recent WI AGM at Leeds, the day's speakers included Sir Andrew Motion (former poet Laureate), Dr George McGavin (entomologist & author) and Bill Turnbull (TV presenter). This year's resolution on increasing organ donation was debated and then passed.
