

How income inequality harms society!

On YouTube recently, I came across a TED talk by Richard Wilkinson with the above title. Using 20 Western nations and data from the UN, he explained what happens when we widen the gap between the rich and poor in society. His talk is not about how much total wealth is generated, but rather how fairly that wealth is shared. His conclusion was that the wider the income inequality gap becomes, then not only is an injustice occurring, but the greater the health and social problems suffered in that society.



The social indices measured included:

- Life Expectancy
- Maths and Literacy
- Infant mortality rates
- Homicide rates
- Imprisonment
- Teenage births
- Trust
- Obesity
- Mental Health, inc addictions
- Social mobility

Of the 20 countries he surveyed, the UK was third worst, in that we have one of the widest gaps between the rich and poor, with only the USA and Portugal having a more unequal society. Japan and the Scandinavian countries were at the other end of the scale. One of his more pithy comments was that, 'if you want to live the American dream (of wealth, health and happiness) you best go live in Denmark.'

In the Old Testament the Jews were given laws concerning rest and justice – the Sabbath laws. One in seven days was to be a day of rest from work, one in seven years a year of rest for the land, and every 50 years - a year of Jubilee -was to be a time when not only the land was restored but also

personal and economic freedom was restored. Slaves were freed and all wealth returned to its original family owners – so no one became too rich, and no one was too poor.

The idea of resting was coupled with that of trusting God to provide for their needs.

So often we are fed the line that the generation of wealth at all costs will be the silver bullet to solve our society's woes. We already have 24 hour shopping, and economic growth is what the politicians aspire to.

But the wisdom of the year of Jubilee and Richard Wilkinson's talk suggest there is more to growing a just and healthy society, than the pursuit of wealth at all costs.


Please note that **Alf** is back. The first Local and Fair trade market for 2015 will be held on 7 March at 10am to 12noon.

If you'd like to sell items, it's simple:

- Goods are to be for newborn to 11 year olds
- Label everything clearly with your name, price and size/age. All labels must be securely attached (with string, sellotape or safety pins no sticky labels please).
- Pricing items is totally up to you but please remember that items are second hand and people are looking for a bargain
- Bring any items you wish to sell to Alne Village Hall on Friday 6th March (between 7.00 – 8.30pm) or on the morning of the sale, Saturday 7 March (9.00 - 9.45am).
- We then collect your labels from items that are sold and use them to calculate how much money you have made. If sold on the day, half of the money goes to the seller and half to Playgroup. For any unnamed goods, the profit all goes to Playgroup.
- If you would like any unsold goods to be returned, please collect them from the Village Hall after the sale (between 12 and 12.30). Otherwise, unclaimed/unsold items will be donated to charity or used to raise further funds for Playgroup.
- We ask that all large items of equipment eg. cots, large outdoor items, car seats, large prams be collected after the sale if unsold.

The delivered price for heating oil in the January delivery was 33.79pppl + VAT (Boilerjuice price = 39.46pppl — a saving to co-operative members of nearly 6p litre with the VAT; even greater if one takes into account the higher prices charged on 500 litre minimum size loads which many Members ask for).

If you are already a member of Alne Oil Co-operative and need oil, either:

- log onto Tate's website www.tateoil.co.uk (preferred option), look for the Lower Swale login button, and fill in the online form with your requirements (you will need the password provided by Tate) or
- If you are unable to use the website, phone the dedicated Lower Swale order line: 01943 854 888

Tate Fuels has undertaken to deliver within 30 days of order, but in practice it is very much less — usually within a week. The price charged will be that applying on the delivery date.

In a recent e-mail, a member said:

Just tested the system, ordered a top up on the 5th January, delivered early pm 6th - fantastic! Being a member, as I have said before, is a "NO BRAINER".

AFFORDABLE HOUSING TOLLERTON

Survey

A site has come forward for an affordable housing scheme in Tollerton and residents are asked to participate in a telephone survey that is being undertaken to assess housing need on our behalf by Arc4. Those residents who have a member of their household or they are in need are asked to let us know what their need requirements are. This survey will also be extended to the neighbouring parishes. All information provided will be kept confidential and not passed to any other third parties other than those involved in the potential scheme.

NEWS FROM ALDWARK AREA PARISH COUNCIL

Grass Cutting

As part of its measures to reduce expenditure, North Yorkshire County Council has decided to cut its programme of grass-cutting throughout the county from April 2015. Whilst grass-cutting along road verges will be maintained where it is essential for road-safety, amenity cutting in towns and villages will be discontinued. This means that the parish council will no longer get a grant of about £500 which it has hitherto used to have the verges cut in our villages. To keep our costs down, but the villages looking tidy, we are therefore asking all residents who have grass verges along the roadside, to kindly keep this grass trimmed wherever possible. We appreciate that many householders do this already, but some, perhaps because of old age or infirmity, may be unable to do this, and in these circumstances it would be appreciated if neighbours would help them out. But if for any reason this is not possible, please contact me, or your local councillor, and we will try to arrange assistance.

May Elections

There are elections for our Parish, District and Parliamentary representatives coming up on 7th May this year. Three of our long-serving councillors, Roland Croke, Henry Dean and Allan Boddy have decided not to stand for re-election. Information about the forthcoming elections will soon be posted on noticeboards and on our website www.aldwarkparish.co.uk and residents are encouraged to consider standing for election.

In an effort to keep our costs and your rates down, the parish council has not replaced our paid clerk, who resigned earlier this year. The jobs previously carried out by the clerk are being shared amongst the other councillors in an unpaid capacity.
