Welby and self worth!



Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury, recently discovered through DNA testing that his biological father was not the man he thought. Both his mother and the man he thought was his father had been alcoholics and so had a rather a chaotic time as young people and a short lived marriage.

Welby's response to this very personal news becoming public knowledge, has been amazingly gracious. He is immensely proud of his mum who at 86 years old has not touched alcohol since 1968 and has led a full life of active public service. Welby himself has known the destructive nature of addiction at first hand and describes the situation as 'a story of redemption and hope from a place of near despair...through the grace and power of Christ to liberate and redeem...I know that I find who I am in Jesus Christ and not in genetics, and my identity in him never changes.'

This led me to ask a question. 'Where do we get our sense of identity or self-worth from?'

During my life time sociologists tell us that this has changed. For my parent's generation, their identity was found in what they did. This could include things such as being a lawyer, a doctor, a coal miner, or house wife. The financial reward was not as important as the role performed. Even today I hear my father who is in his 80s chatting with his friends, and what they 'did' is a common subject in conversation.

Over my life time this sense of identity and where we get our self-worth from has changed so that today it comes largely from what we consume. This consumption can be material goods – the latest technological toy, or experiences – round the world trips, etc. Progress is seen as maximising choice and the currency of consumerism is money which is needed to

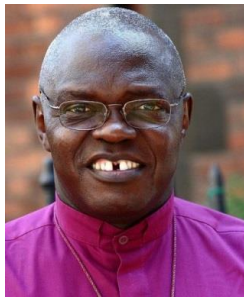
exercise that choice. This means that in a society where consumerism is the major value, the poor are excluded and have no place, because they cannot consume!

Justin Welby, showing his personal self-awareness says, 'I know that I find who I am in Jesus Christ and not in genetics, and my identity in him never changes.' As a Christian Justin Welby has found his sense of worth in being known and loved unconditionally by God, not in what he does or what he consumes.

Sometimes we all get writers block! Times when our intentions are good but we just don't know what to say. And then suddenly it hits us...a grand idea, I wonder where that aha! moment comes from? Generally, I guess it is just the moment we stop thinking too hard and allow the brain cells a bit of space, but when it comes to writing sermons, or magazine articles for that matter I believe the Holy Spirit inspires me. That got me thinking, about that stagnant period of time between the risen Jesus appearing to his friends and disciples, and promising them that He would soon be leaving them again; but would be sending them a helper that would never leave them.

I wonder if they just sat back and relaxed, giving their brains a bit of space, or if they began rushing around trying to think of what to do or say. I am sure that doing that in their own strength would surely have made them frazzled and exhausted. Imagine Paul and his friends travelling around on their missionary journeys around the Mediterranean; talking about Jesus, trying to find the right words when they were challenged, often not welcomed, at times beaten and imprisoned for their beliefs, if they had not had the empowerment and inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

How often do we try to manage, with all the hassles life throws at us, with our own strength? We get burnt out, and at times just don't know what way to turn. Then in desperation, when all else has failed, we decide to pray, and suddenly all becomes clear. Prayers are answered and the problems seem to fade away. Personally the times I have cried out to the Lord are the times when I have felt closest to God, but always the peace that comes, comes with the thought that if only I had turned this problem to God sooner?

Why do we use prayer as a last resort? As Christians, we know that when we ask for the strength of the Holy Spirit, God answers our prayers, this does not mean that being a Christian is easy, or that **all** our problems disappear, but it does mean that just like the disciples, when we have the inspiration and empowerment of the Spirit of the living Christ, all things become possible, even endurance in times of crisis. Let us ask God now for His strength, and invite the Holy Spirit into our lives.

If you are already a Co-operative Member and need oil, go to Tate's website: www.tateoil.co.uk. Look on the menu bar on the homepage for "Buying Groups" and select LSOS (Lower Swale Oil Syndicate) to login (you will need the password provided by Tate Fuels) then fill in the online form with your requirements.

Please remember that Weights and Measures legislation requires you to take a minimum of 500 litres. If estimating your requirement to fill your tank, please be as accurate as possible as the tankers only carry what has been ordered for that day's delivery run.

Tate Fuels have undertaken to deliver within 10 working days from order. The price charged will be that applying on the delivery date.
